Prevent-the-surprise check

Run through this list once before the month starts and again at the midpoint. The goal isn't to handle everything today. It's to make sure nothing on this list catches you off guard later.

Upcoming fees, forms, or deadlines:

Transportation changes (carpools, schedule shifts, travel):

Household maintenance due this month (filters, oil change, yard, etc.):

Anyone in the family with a hard week coming (test, tournament, surgery, deadline):

One question to ask out loud at the family meeting
